The Three Treasures or Refuges are the unifying principles of all Buddhist traditions. In the development of a modern Buddhist movement in India among the most oppressed peoples, the Dalits. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar spoke of Liberty, Equality, and Fraternity as the heart of Buddha's teachings. There is a rich resonance between these ways of living and structuring an enlightened society.
